HYPOTHESIS FOR LANGUAGE LEARNING

Social annotation works right on top of existing course content to:

- Help break down reading for better development of vocabulary and grammar skills
- Cultivate a range of metacognitive reading strategies
- Encourage cultural engagement with and immersion in the language of study
- Facilitate purposeful asynchronous communication outside of the classroom
